PROCEDURES IN CASE OF A VEGETATION FIRE

- 1. Park the car unlocked, with the keys in the ignition and facing the exit. Keep the windows closed and have valuables already packed in the car.
- 2. Relocate family members, livestock, and pets to a safe place in a timely manner.
- 3. Fill as many containers as possible with water.
- 4. Place towels or other fabrics into the water containers.
- 5. Wear cotton clothing and high footwear that fully covers your body.
- 6. Close all windows and doors of the house.
- 7. Turn off the gas.
- 8. Switch off lights in the house, porch, garage, and other areas.
- 9. Move flammable materials, such as light curtains and furniture, away from windows and to the center of the house.
- 10. Remove all flammable objects away from the house, including firewood, upholstered items, etc.
- 11. Listen to the local radio station for up-to-date information about the fire and possible road closures.
- 12. Cover your head, protect your eyes with goggles, and cover your face, nose, and mouth with a damp cloth or towel; put gloves or socks on your hands.
- 13. When the fire intensity reaches its peak, retreat into the building, place wet cloths around doors and windows to block heat and embers, and use water for possible extinguishing.
- 14. Check external horizontal gutters and attics, as fires often start there.
- 15. Continuously patrol rooms in the house to ensure embers and fire haven't breached the defenses.
- 16. In heavy smoke, stay as low as possible, since smoke rises due to heat.
- 17. Keep a flashlight with you.
- 18. Remain cautious even after the fire has passed.
